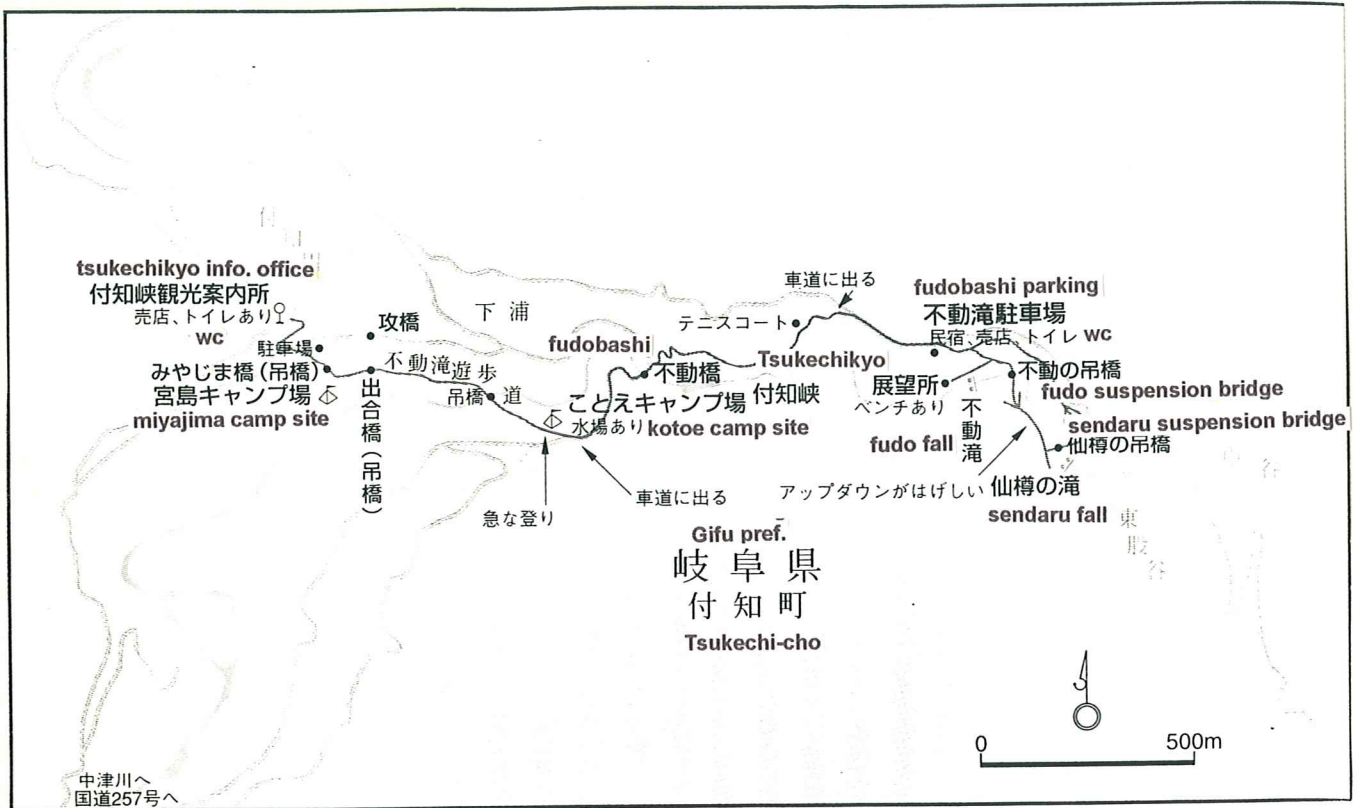


# ③ TSUKECHIKYO FUDO-TAKI PROMENADE

## 付知峡不動滝遊歩道



### Visiting Two Splendid Falls

Torrents from mountains in Eastern Mino run together, become the River Tsukechi and then flow into the River Kiso through beautiful valleys.

The valley areas along the River Tsukechi are called Tsukechikyo, and there are more than 100 valleys rich in scenery.

Walking along the Fudo Falls Promenade you can visit not only the Fudo Falls and the Sendaru Falls but beautiful river valleys with a lot of other waterfalls and streams.

### Around the Fudo Falls

Around the Fudo Falls there are V-shaped deep valleys, which are well maintained, but the slopes with quite a few steps are a bit hard for some travelers. Descend the dimly lit path surrounded by tall cypresses and enormous rocks, and after a while, you will find the falls by listening for the loud sound on your left below.

### To the Sendo Falls

After taking a good rest at the Fudo Falls, go to Sendo Falls at the upper end of the stream. Cross a big suspension bridge to the opposite bank, and you will come across the Sendo Falls.

**[Access]** 1 hour and 5 min from JR Nagoya Station (Chuo line) to Nakatsugawa by a local rapid train, then take a Kitaena Bus to Tsukechikyo tourist information office (1 hour and 5 min)

**[Return]** Take the same route but in reverse, heading towards Nagoya Station.

**[Fare]** About ¥4900.-
