# OKU-IRUKA AND HASSO SHIZEN KYUYORIN

## 奥入鹿と八曾自然休養林

### Walking Through the Woods with Valleys and Falls

Inuyama Hasso Shizen Kyuyo-rin (or natural recreation forest) is to the east of Inuyama City, where there are various hiking courses.

Take the bus to the main gate of Meiji Mura.

(Remember to check the bus schedule for your return)

Start walking from the gate in the direction of Iruka pond, and a while later you will be at a junction where the road along the pond and the original road meet.

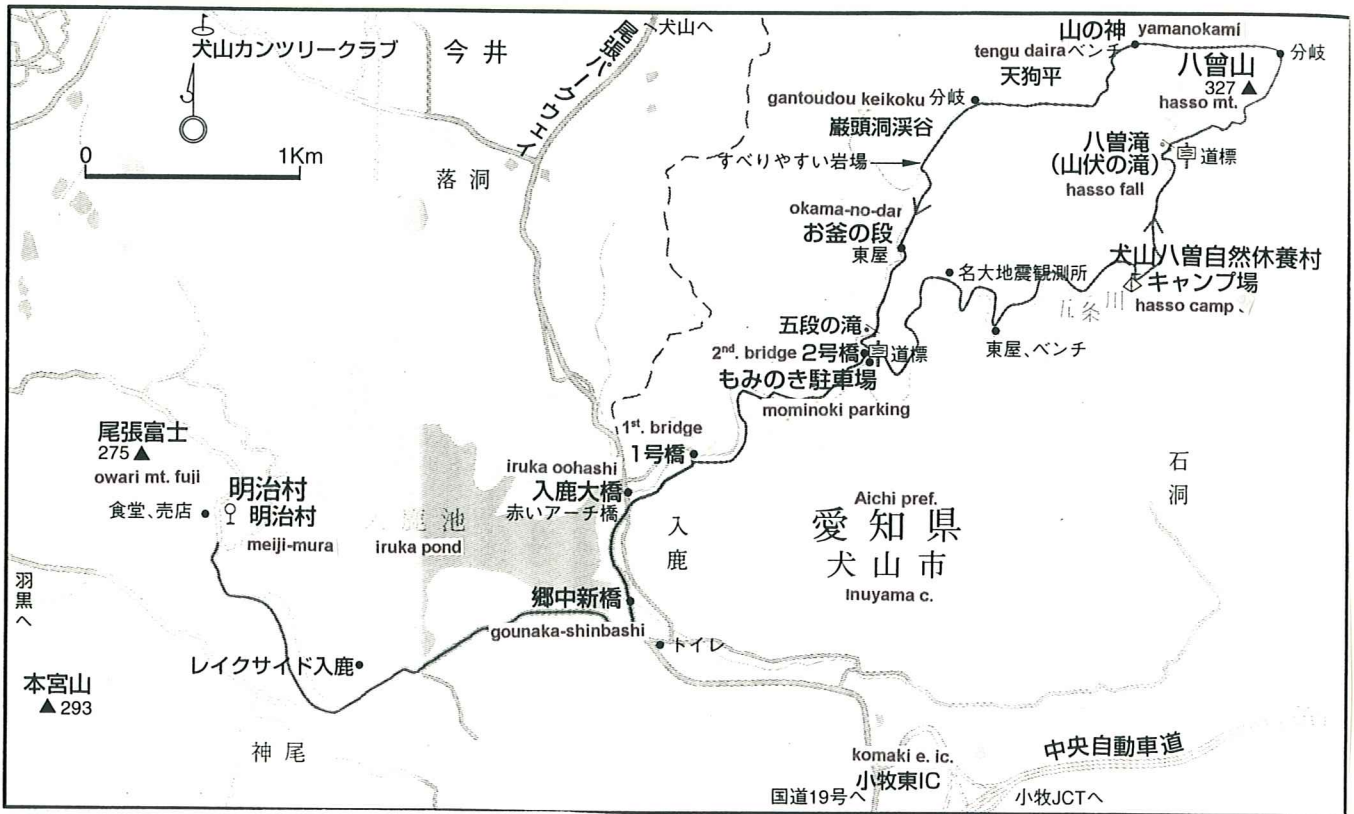
After passing by the Mominoki Parking Area, take the pebbled forestry path on the left of the large signpost for Inuyama-Hasso Shizen Kyuyo-rin.

The road along the Gojo River is rich in wild grasses and birds in spring.

In several minutes you will reach the Inuyama-Hasso Shizen Kyuyo-rin campsite.

### Hasso Falls to the Top of Mt. Hasso

This waterfall is also called the Yamabushi-no-taki (waterfall for training mountain priests) and the water falls down from a height of about 18 meters. After taking a brief rest there, you can start again for the top of the mountain (326.9m high), from where you can get a good view of Inuyama City and beyond.



**[Access]** Meitetsu Shin-Nagoya to Inuyama (30 min. by express) then Meitetsu Bus to Meijumura (20 min.) **[Return]** Take the reverse course. **[Fare]** About ¥1800.-
