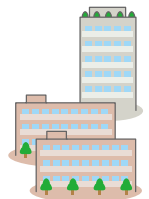


Information	-The most general method of searching for housing is through a real estate agent. -Information on rental housing is also available at Nagoya International Center. -Your workplace or university may also provide information. -Private housing consultations are available at the Sumai no Madoguchi Service Center (reservations: 052-961-4555).
Guarantor	-You may be asked to secure a joint guarantor, emergency contact person, etc.
Payment	-Most housing contracts include payment of <i>reikin</i> (key money), and <i>shikikin</i> (a security deposit), agent charge and residence insurance fee. -There is usually a service fee (for common-area heating, lighting and cleaning) in addition to monthly rent.

Ward offices or branch offices 	For persons under the age of 75 who are not covered by health insurance at work and expect to stay in Japan for more than 3 months: -Insurance fees are charged according to your employment income and must be paid. -Present your Insurance Certificate at a hospital to receive treatment and bear only a portion of the total cost.

// National Pension

Ward offices or branch offices	For self-employed individuals and students over the age of 20 and under the age of 60: -All must pay the same insurance fee regardless of income. -If you are in a position where paying a premium is difficult or are a student, you can apply for the pension premium exemption system. // Nursing Care Insurance

Ward offices or branch offices 	For persons aged 40 and over staying in Japan for more than 3 months: -Nursing Care Insurance fees are calculated according to income and must be paid. (Payment is received together with medical insurance from persons aged 40 to 64.) -Persons aged 65 and over are eligible to use nursing care and support services if needed. (Persons aged 40 to 64 with any of 16 types of age-related illness are eligible to use nursing care and support services if needed.) -Certification of Needed Long-Term Care is required before nursing care services can be used. -Users bear 10%, 20% or 30% of the costs incurred.

Separation and Collection of Recyclables and Garbage

- Separate recyclables and garbage into the appropriate category, and place in the appropriate designated bag before disposal.
- Put out recyclables and garbage by 8:00 (7:00 in Naka Ward) on the morning of the collection day.
- Collection also takes place on national holidays (except for the end-of-year / New Year period).
- Designated bags are sold at supermarkets, convenience stores, etc.
- A "Guide to Sorting Recyclables and Garbage in Nagoya"

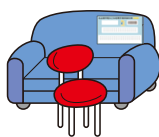

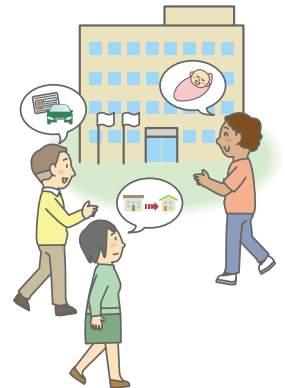

Moving to and from a Different Area 	Ward offices or branch offices	You must submit a notice of moving out to the local government office of your previous place of residence before moving (the notice of moving out is unnecessary when moving within Nagoya) and submit a notice of moving to the office that handles residency at your new location within 14 days.
Marriage Registration	Ward offices or branch offices	Procedure may differ depending on nationality. Those with the status of residence of “Spouse of a Japanese National”, “Spouse of a Permanent Resident” or “Dependent” must submit notification of divorce to the Immigration Bureau within 14 days.

Registration of Birth	Ward offices or branch offices	See p.13
Death Registration	Ward offices or branch offices	Registration of death must be submitted within seven days of acknowledgment of death. The deceased’s resident card must be returned to the Immigration Bureau within 14 days. Those who, due to marriage to a person now deceased, have the status of residence of “Spouse of a Japanese National”, “Spouse of a Permanent Resident”, or “Dependent”, must submit notification of death to the Immigration Bureau within 14 days.
Registration of Seal (<i>inkan</i> or <i>hanko</i>) 	Ward offices or branch offices	In Japan, seals printing your given name and/or family name are used as the equivalent of signatures in other countries. Seals that are registered with the local municipal authority are called jitsuin. Any transactions in which a jitsuin and its registration certificate (used to verify the authenticity of the jitsuin) are used are considered legally binding.
Municipal and Prefectural Residents Tax, Forest Environment Tax 	Sakae Municipal Tax Office (Residents of Chikusa-ku, Higashi-ku, Kita-ku, Naka-ku, Moriyama-ku and Meito-ku) TEL 052-959-3303	-If a foreign resident has an address within Japan as of January 1st of a particular year (the base date for assessment), then he or she must pay residence tax to the municipality in which he or she resides as of January 1st for the income received from January to December of the previous year. In addition to the residence tax, you will also be required to pay the national forest environment tax. -Residence tax, a local tax levied separately from national income tax, is divided into municipal residence tax and prefectural residence tax. -The amount of residence tax is determined by income, number of dependents, and other factors. - For more details, see the pamphlet : “Guide to Japanese Personal Taxes”  “To Foreign Residents: Payment of Municipal and Prefectural Resident Tax”

Japanese Driver's License	Driver's License Testing Center TEL 052-800-1352	A holder of a foreign license may be exempted from taking a part (written/practical) of the driving test if assessed and confirmed as having no impairment to drive in Japan, and the following conditions are met: -A proof of stay for over three months after obtaining the license in the same country is required (passport or other documents showing the duration of stay.) -The overseas license must be valid.

// When you get pregnant

Procedure	Contact	Content
Notification of Pregnancy 	<i>Hoken Senta</i> (Health Center)	You will receive a <i>Boshi Kenko Techo</i> (Maternal and Child Health Handbook) to record the health condition of mother and child. It includes a booklet with coupons for pregnancy and nursing checkups and infant health checks.

// When a child is born

Procedure	Contact	Content
Registration of Birth 	Ward offices or branch offices	A birth must be registered within 14 days of the date of birth. Take the <i>Boshi Kenko Techo</i> (Maternal and Child Health Handbook) with you to register at your ward or branch office. If you intend for the child to reside in Japan for more than 60 days, you must apply to Nagoya Regional Immigration Services Bureau to obtain a status of residence within 30 days of birth. If both or either parent is a foreign national, you must report the birth to your home country. Procedure varies depending on country or region. Please inquire at an embassy or consulate of your country in Japan.
Notification of Birth	<i>Hoken Senta</i> (Health Center)	Please submit a notification via the postcard attached to the booklet you receive with the <i>Boshi Kenko Techo</i> (Maternal and Child Health Handbook).
Lump-sum Birth Allowance	Ward offices or branch offices	If you have National Health Insurance, you can receive 500,000 yen for giving birth.
National Health Insurance (See p.6)	Ward offices or branch offices	If you are covered by National Health Insurance, you must enroll your child within 14 days from the date of birth.
Child Medical Fee Subsidy	Ward offices or branch offices	Subsidized for children aged 0 up to 18 years old (Subsidized up to the 31 March following the child's 18th birthday.) Amount of health insurance-covered medical care expenses to be borne by user is subsidized.
Child Allowance 	Ward offices or branch offices	For those raising infants and children up to the 3 rd year of junior high school: Application must be completed within 15 days of the day after the child's birth to receive the allowance. You may need to submit a report of your current circumstances every June.
Vaccinations 	<i>Hoken Senta</i> (Health Center)	Vaccinations are administered at hospitals. Please bring your <i>Boshi Kenko Techo</i> (Maternal and Child Health Handbook) on the day of vaccination.
Nursery Schools	Ward offices or branch offices	For infants and children until they start elementary school: Nursery schools are childcare facilities that take care of children whose parent(s) or guardian(s) is (are) unable to take care of them due to employment or other reasons.

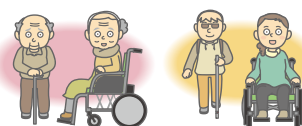

Traffic Rules

- In Japan, cars, motorcycles, bicycles and other vehicles travel on the left side, and pedestrians walk on the right
- Follow road rules when using roads
- At traffic lights, obey the traffic lights
- Driving after drinking is subject to severe penalties
- Driving without a license is subject to severe penalties
- Driving while using a smartphone is prohibited
- Enroll in car or bicycle insurance



■Pedestrians

- Walk on the sidewalk
- Walk on the right-hand side of the road when there is no sidewalk
- Use pedestrian crossings where possible



■Bicycles

- In principle, ride in single file on the left side of the road
- When riding on the sidewalk is allowed, yield to pedestrians and drive slowly on the side nearest the road
- Riding after drinking alcohol, riding with two people on one bicycle, using an umbrella while riding, riding side-to-side with another bicycle, and using a smartphone while riding are all prohibited
- Use a bike light at night
- Wear a helmet when riding a bicycle

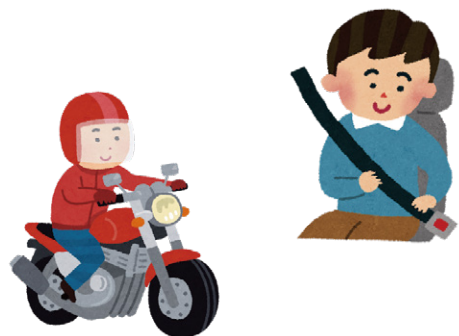


■Motorized Scooters

- Headlights, turn signal lights, brake lights, and number plates are required
- In principle, scooters must be used on roads for vehicles
- Operation by people under 16 years old is prohibited
- A helmet must be worn when riding a scooter

■Cars and Motorcycles

- Driver and all passengers must wear seat belts
- Children under 6 must use a child car seat
- A helmet must be worn when riding a motorcycle

■IC Card “Manaca”

- Ride by just touching your card on the wicket or bus fare box.
- Five kinds available: ¥1,000, ¥2,000, ¥3,000, ¥5,000 and ¥10,000.
(Sale prices include ¥500 deposit. Usable amount is the ticket price less ¥500 deposit.)
- A single Manaca can be charged and used repeatedly.
- Earn mileage points as you ride. Mileage Points can be used to pay for City Bus and Subway fares.
- A discount of ¥80 for adults (¥40 for children) is applied when connecting from City Bus to City Bus, or City Bus to Subway, etc. within 90 minutes.
- Use on services within the Manaca area including the Aonami Line, Yutorito Line, Meitetsu Trains, Meitetsu Buses, Toyohashi Railway network, and Linimo; and other areas where mutual use of transport IC cards is permitted.

Be Prepared for Disasters

- Discuss with your family where to evacuate and means of contacting one another (such as the Disaster Emergency Message Dial 171 system or Disaster Message Board service).
- Prepare emergency supplies (food, drinking water, valuables, clothing, medical supplies, radio, flashlights, etc.) to take with you.
- Prevent furniture from falling in an earthquake by securing furniture to walls with metal fittings, etc.
- Familiarize yourself with the potential risk to your area by checking each type of hazard map.
- Confirm how to get to your nearest Designated Evacuation Shelter, Designated Emergency Assembly Point and emergency water supply by consulting hazard maps, etc.

***Designated Emergency Assembly Point:** A place to initially evacuate to in order to protect yourself from danger (will vary depending on the type of disaster)

***Designated Evacuation Shelter:** A place to live as an evacuee temporarily when you are unable to return to your damaged home

***Emergency Water Supply:** A place where you can receive water when the water service is unavailable due to a disaster

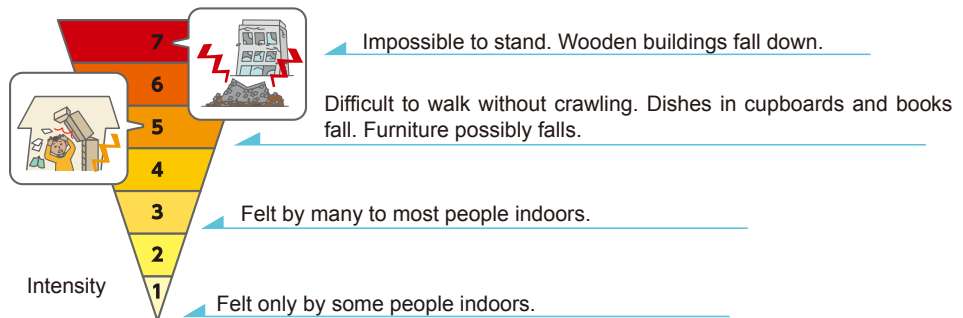

// Earthquakes

Japan is one of the world's most earthquake-prone countries. Memorize what you should do in the event of an earthquake in order not to panic.

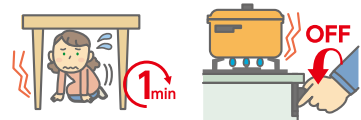
■Earthquake scale



■In the event of a major earthquake:

A violent tremor will last for around the first minute.

- Hide yourself under a steady table or desk.
- When shaking stops, turn off heaters and stove burners.
- Open the door to escape.
- Do not rush outside.
- Gather information via radio or TV.



■What is the Nankai Trough Earthquake Extra Information?

This is a bulletin issued by the Japan Meteorological Agency when there is a high probability that an earthquake will occur along the Nankai Trough. If the Extra Information is issued, remain calm and follow directions issued by the City of Nagoya, etc. and prepare accordingly. *There is no guarantee that the Extra Information will be issued prior to the occurrence of an earthquake.

// Tsunami

After an earthquake occurs, and a Tsunami Warning or Major Tsunami Warning has been issued for Ise / Mikawa Bays, the City of Nagoya will issue an Evacuation Order for designated evacuation areas (*), where residents should evacuate to a location out of reach of tsunami. If there is insufficient time, seek refuge in a Tsunami Evacuation Building (a Designated Emergency Assembly Point for tsunami emergencies). The Evacuation Order will be announced by sirens, City PR vehicles, etc.

*Evacuation areas:

Tsunami Warning: parts of Minato Ward

Major Tsunami Warning: Nakamura, Mizuho, Atsuta, Nakagawa, Minato, Minami and Midori Wards

■Tsunami Evacuation Building (Designated Emergency Assembly Point for tsunami emergencies)

These buildings serve as temporary evacuation places after an earthquake occurs and a Tsunami Warning / Major Tsunami Warning has been issued for Ise / Mikawa Bays. The sign on the right is displayed at the entrance to these buildings.

Areas: Nakamura, Mizuho, Atsuta, Nakagawa, Minato, Minami and Midori Wards



// Be Prepared for Typhoons and Floods

Typhoons (tropical cyclones) and heavy rains can occur from June to October. Torrential downpours concentrated on narrow areas may also occur. Pay careful attention to weather forecasts on TV or radio.

■ Advisories, Warnings and Emergency Warnings (Issued by JMA)

	Content	Your Response
Advisories	Advise that a disaster is predicted.	-Pay attention to weather forecast and outside. -Check emergency supplies, shelters and directions. -Check around the outside of your house to prepare for disaster.
Warnings	Warning that a serious disaster may occur.	-Pay attention to information related to disasters and escape immediately if needed.
Emergency Warning	Warning issued when there is a significant risk that a serious disaster may occur.	-Take immediate action to protect yourself. -Evacuate to the upper floor of a building or a Designated Emergency Assembly Point as necessary. -If it is dangerous to move outdoors, move to a secure location within your home.

■ Evacuation Information (Issued by Nagoya City)

Alert Level 3 - Notice to Evacuate for Elderly and Disabled People	Issued to prompt elderly and other residents to evacuate from dangerous areas due to the possibility that a disaster may occur. Announced via City PR vehicles, the Internet, TV and radio, etc. Elderly people and those who require more time to evacuate should commence evacuation from dangerous areas. Other people should pay attention to weather information, and make preparations to evacuate.
Alert Level 4 - Evacuation Order	Issued to prompt residents to evacuate due to the high probability of the area being affected by disaster. In addition to announcements via City PR vehicles, the Internet, TV and radio, etc., sirens will also be sounded. All people should evacuate from dangerous areas quickly. If moving to a designated evacuation area seems dangerous, evacuate to a nearby safe location or high place indoors.
Alert Level 5 - Emergency Safety Order	Issued when a disaster situation is already underway or imminent to prompt residents to take action to protect themselves. People in dangerous areas should take immediate action to protect themselves by moving to a nearby building which will offer protection from inundation.

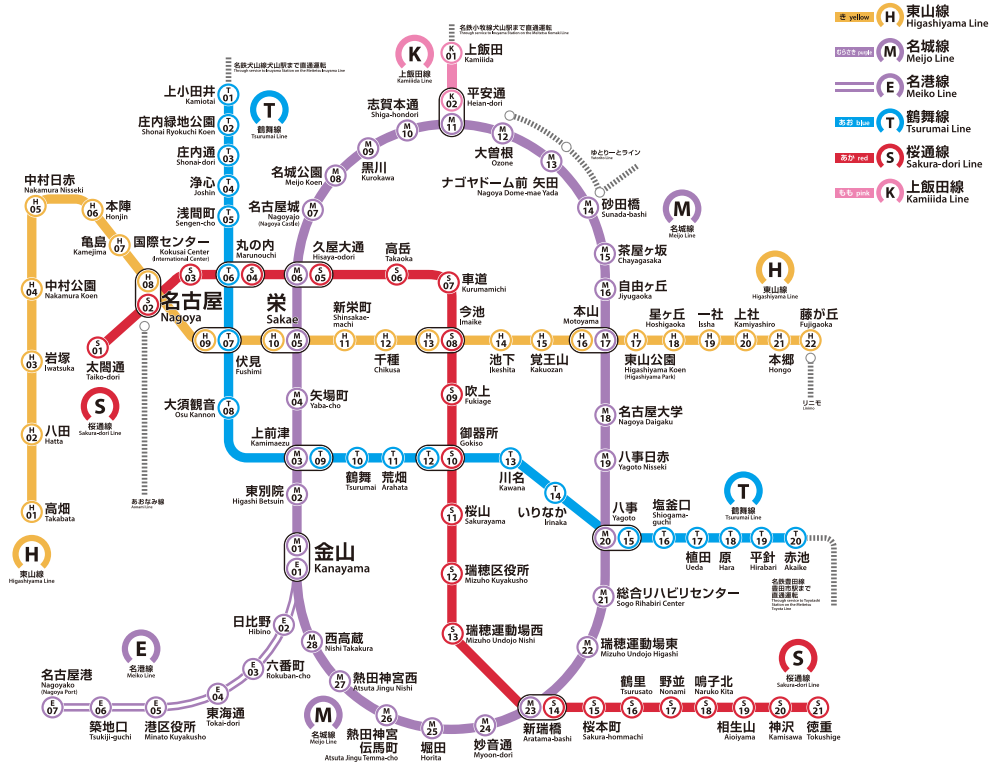
