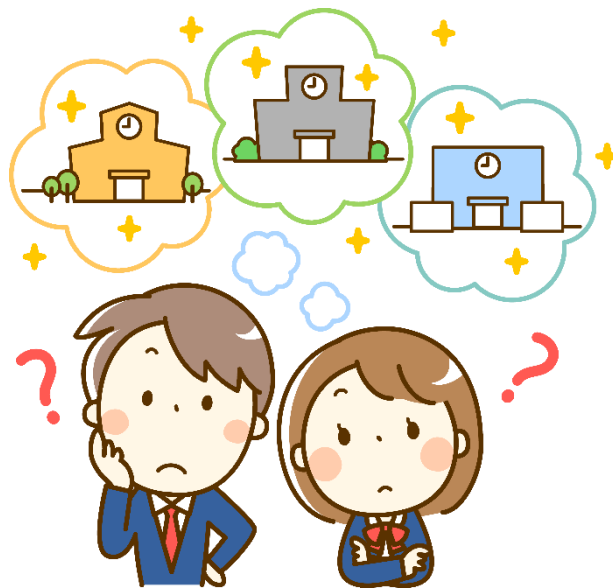

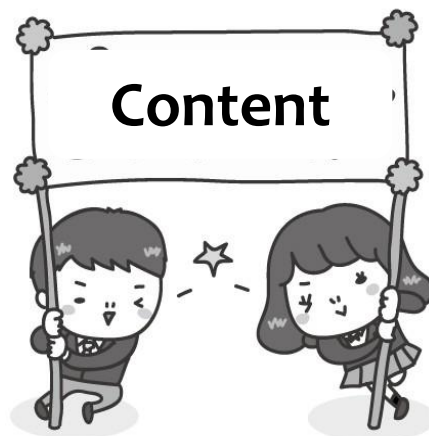

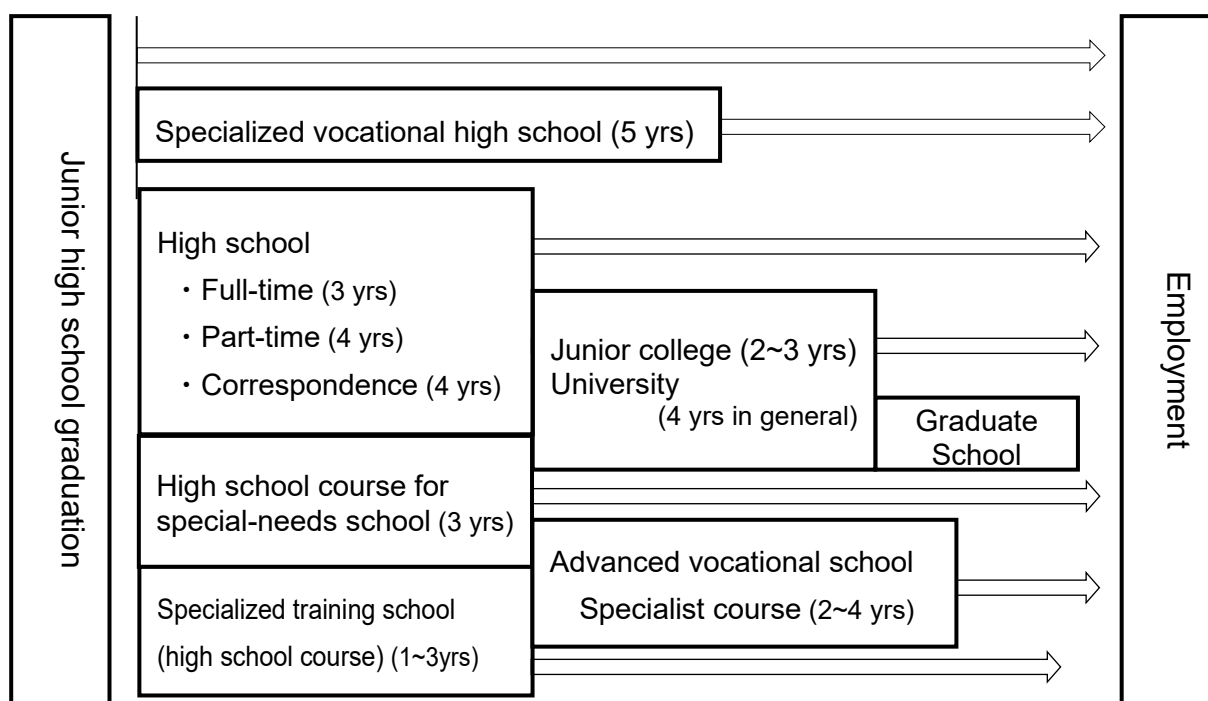

I Career Path after Junior High School Graduation and Preparation for High School

1. Main career path after graduation from Junior high school

After graduating from junior high school, students work or go on to high school.

In most cases, they take an academic achievement test and take part in an admissions interview.



After graduating from high school, the number and types of jobs available increase.



If you have not graduated from junior high school, you cannot go on to high school.



If you are not enrolled in a junior high school, please refer to "II Career paths for students not enrolled in a junior high school" on page 10.

2. Types of high schools

(1) Public high schools and Private high schools

Public high schools	Private high schools
○ In addition to the general education curriculum, there are comprehensive courses, courses specialized in engineering, commerce etc. ○ There are also part-time courses and correspondence courses.	○ Different high schools have different educational policies. ○ Some schools offer engineering or commercial courses.

(2) Other high schools, etc.

National High Schools and National Technical High Schools are available.

Specialized training school (high school course) offer high school diplomas.

3. Regarding public high schools

※From the 2024 Entrance Examination, applications are submitted online.

(1) Full-time courses and Part-time courses

Full-time courses	Part-time courses
○ Students study from morning until evening. ○ The length of study is 3 years.	○ In the regular daytime course, students study for 4 hours during the daytime. ○ Evening classes begin in the evening and run for 4 hours. ○ The length of study is 4 years. ○ Graduation is possible in 3 years.

There are also correspondence high schools.

(2) Various courses

General course	Students study Japanese, mathematics, English, and other subjects. Students can choose to pursue higher education or to find employment.
Specialized courses	There are courses specialized in engineering, commerce, agriculture, home economics, welfare etc. Students learn specialized knowledge and skills.
Comprehensive course	Students can choose the curriculum that best suits their future career path.

Some private high schools offer courses specialized in engineering, commerce, etc.

(3) Regarding entrance examinations for full-time course students at public high schools

① Examination for foreign students

The applicant must be a foreign national whose parent or guardian has been in Japan for less than 6 years.

The applicant will have to take an academic achievement test and an individual interview.

Academic achievement tests consist of basic questions in Japanese, mathematics, and English with ruby characters above the Chinese characters (*kanji*).

② General selection

Public high schools are divided into two groups: Group A and Group B.

You may apply up to two high schools, one from Group A and one from Group B.

The test is a multiple-choice style mark-sheet system that includes Japanese, social studies, mathematics, science, and English.

You can only take the academic achievement test once.

Some schools require an interview.



For an explanation of "Group A" and "Group B," please refer to the to [Document 1] on page 11.

③ Selection by recommendation

Applicants must be recommended by a junior high school to enter this course.

Applicants will have in an interview.

④ Special Selection

Some schools conduct this screening.

You will be interviewed. Additionally, one of the following be required: essay, basic academic ability test, presentation, etc.

⑤ Selection of returnee student

Those who have lived abroad for more than two years with a parent or guardian and who have been back in Japan for less than two years are able to take the examination.

The returnee student will have to take an academic ability test and participate in an interview.

(4) Regarding entrance examinations for part-time courses at public high schools

The academic ability test consists of basic questions in Japanese, mathematics, and English. There is also an essay and an interview.

You can take the entrance examination for the part-time courses at public high schools from anywhere in within Aichi prefecture.

4. Regarding private high schools

(1) Private high schools characteristics

Each private high schools has its own special characteristics. You can gather information from each school at their school information sessions and at the Aichi Private Schools Exhibition.

(2) Private high schools entrance examinations

Admission on recommendation and through the General Entrance Examination are available.

Admission on recommendation	General Entrance Examination
○Take the entrance examination for one school only. ○If you pass the entrance examination, do not take the entrance examination at other schools. ○You will take a scholastic ability test and an interview.	○Applicants may take the entrance examination at more than one school. ○You can also take the examination at a public high school ○Students can also take the five-subject academic achievement test. ※Some schools require three subjects. ※Some schools require an interview.

5. Regarding specialized training schools (high school course)

(1) Specialized training school (high school course) characteristics

Specialized training schools are private institutions.

Students can acquire skills and qualifications that will lead to work.

Many of the schools offer high school diplomas.

(2) What you will you learn

Clothing • Home Economics	Students learn about fashion and cooking.
Industrial fields	Students learn about electricity, electronics, machinery, etc.
Hygiene	Students learn about cooking, beauty, and hairdressing.
Commercial practice	Students learn about business.
Cultural and educational fields (design)	Students learn about design, fine arts, music, etc.
Welfare	Students about welfare and nursing care.

You can gather information about these schools at school information sessions and the Aichi Senior High School Exhibition.

(3) Specialized training school (high school course) entrance examinations

Since the examinations vary depending on the school you are applying to, check with your school's teacher.

6. Pathway Guidance at Junior High Schools

(1) Career guidance

Third-year students and their parents/guardians gather in the gymnasium to listen to explanations about their career paths.

There will be an explanation of how to decide on a career path.

You can hear about what kind of career paths graduates have chosen.

(2) Career preference survey

On the survey form given to you by the school, write down which school you would like to go to.

The deadline for submitting your application is a few days after receiving the form.

(3) Individual meeting / Parent-teacher-student meeting

Students, parents, and homeroom teachers will discuss individually to decide on a specific course of study.

(4) Career Pathways Bulletin and Pamphlet

You will receive a school's career path newsletter, pamphlets, and other materials.

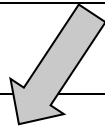
They contain important information such as the deadline for submitting documents.

You can apply to a junior high school or directly to a high school's website.



Participate in a meeting where private high schools and special training schools gather at a single location to explain their programs.
There are booths where you can consult individually.
The schedule is written on pages 5 and 6.

8. Online Applications

Public high schools in Aichi Prefecture use an online application system.

Your application must be registered online.

You must print out the examination voucher delivered to you online and bring it with you on the day of the examination.

The application site can be accessed from a computer, smartphone, tablet, etc.

You will need an email address to register for the online application.

Please have it ready in advance.

The national and prefectural governments provide subsidies to help you study at high school, but only after you have enrolled in school.

It is important to make necessary financial preparations before entering school.



Admission fees for private high schools

Applicants accepted following an entrance examination for applicants with recommendations are to pay the full amount of the admission fee within several days of the acceptance announcement.

Applicants accepted following a general entrance examination are to pay part (20,000 Yen) of the admission fee within several days of the acceptance announcement. Pay the remaining amount after the acceptance announcement for public high schools.

If the admission fee is not paid, **acceptance to the school will be cancelled!** Be sure to check, and pay on time.

10. Scholarship System

There are systems that subsidize entrance and tuition fees. Some require you to return the money, while others do not.

(1) What you do not have to return

Depending on the family's income, the following types of assistance are available.

Please apply at the high school where you entered.

(2) What you have to return

①Aichi Prefecture Social Welfare Council Livelihood Welfare Fund (Education Support Fund)

You can borrow up to 35,000 yen per month (subject to income restrictions).

Please apply to the social welfare council where you live.

②National Education Loan

This is a government loan that can be taken out before entering high school.

The loan should be repaid within 15 years.

While you are attending school, you can reduce the amount you have to pay back.

II Main career path for those who have not enrolled in junior high school

(1) Those who have not graduated from Junior High School

There are the following ways to qualify for junior high school graduation.

① Evening Junior High School

In the 2025 academic year, the following two night junior high schools were opened.

●Nagoya City Nagoyaka Junior High School

●Aichi Prefectural Toyohashi Junior High School

For those who are 15 years old or older and who have not graduated from junior high school.

All junior high school subjects are taught.

You will graduate from junior high school after you complete all the designated classes.

There are classes five days a week. Tuition and textbooks are free.

School information sessions will be held for both from summer to fall.

※Evening Junior High school that are scheduled to open after April 2026

(An information session will be held in August.)

② Examination of junior high school graduation equivalency certification

This is a national examination that recognizes the standard of scholastic ability equivalent of junior high school graduation for those who are 15 years old or older and who do not graduate from junior high school.

Takes five academic subjects (Japanese, Social studies, Mathematics, Science and English) is required.

You can take the exam with phonetic (*kana*) provided.

Passes in all five academic subjects will earn a candidate the eligibility to enter a high school.

Examination fee is free.

Examination are held once every year (in October).

Application to be submitted between July and the beginning of September.

(2) Those who have graduated from Junior High School outside of Japan

You need to submit the documents which prove you finished the education for 9 years.

Bring the documents to Aichi prefectural Board of Education and have them checked.

Please make sure to visit the Board of Education until December, as it takes time to have all the documents checked.

【Document 1】

Regarding Group A and Group B in public high schools (Full time course)

For public high schools, student may select and take examinations up to two schools based on his/her preference (First preference ・ Second preference).

The schools are divided into Group A and Group B.

Student may choose 1 school from Group A, and 1 school from Group B.

Student may take only one examination of his/her choice as well.

【General Course】

General course is divided into the Owari district and Mikawa district.

Only schools in the district one resides may be selected.

The Owari district of the General course is further divided into Group 1 and Group 2

Features of the school (time schedule, subjects, school events & career path after graduation)	Schedule and Subjects: Two-thirds of the classes are for learning general subjects and one-third are for commercial-related specialized subjects. Commercial subjects such as book keeping and information processing are to be studied in the first year. Starting in the 2nd year, students select the commercial subjects in accordance with the student's interests. Mainly students choose business-related classes. In addition, for students who have been selected for admission as foreign nationals, each grade offers Japanese language classes (2 hours per week) as an elective subject. School Events: Ball games, cultural and athletic festivals, school excursions, field trips and art appreciation activities are held at the school.
